

## <u>About</u>

Building on from the successes of YCF's regular Summer Opportunities Fund, Young Camden Foundation wanted to continue to offer support to children and young people in the borough during what we expected to be an unprecedented winter of 2022/23.

This was the first time YCF had run a winter fund, launched in specific response to the rapidly growing levels of need within our communities across Camden as a result of the cost-of-living crisis. In particular, as many families in Camden are often forced to choose between eating and heating, we saw it as vital to provide support to those organisations who were offering a warm space to young people in the borough, alongside enriching and fun activities, over the difficult Winter period.

Owing to successful fundraising, we were able to run two rounds of this fund, in December 2022 and January 2023, supporting programmes from the winter holidays and up to February half term.

We offer thanks to all members who participated in the fund, as well as to Derwent London, Shaftesbury Capital, The Big Give, The Childhood Trust, and Camden residents for their generous donations, which made this grant programme possible.


