WELCOME FROM THE CEO

Welcome to YCF's vision for 2022 to 2025.

I have the privilege of being CEO of the Young Camden Foundation, a role I am proud to hold as I know first-hand the opportunities and challenges that come with growing up here.



As a child, I was raised by a single parent and grew up in social housing. I was one of many children in Camden who received free school meals and ended up being in the first generation in my family to go to university. It was Camden's educational opportunities and investment in young people, from the arts provision that gave me confidence to the work experience placements that helped me write my first CV, that afforded me opportunities to thrive in so many ways. These have all contributed to where I am today.

Today, the outlook for the sector and for children and young people looks very different, making our work more important than ever. Children and young people have been worst impacted economically, psychologically and educationally by the pandemic, and it is our responsibility to address those many needs, which YCF's members do in a sector that has seen its own funding reduced drastically.

From cultural associations to mental health provision and play, Camden still has some of the best youth provision in London and is a borough of incredible professional and social opportunity, led by a local authority that is committed to its community. As a proud membership organisation, we see the powerful, life-changing work our members do every day. At the same time, Camden continues to face its own problems of inequality of opportunity in a community where 37% of children grow up and live in relative poverty.

We look to 2025 with the confidence that we are meeting a need that is greater than ever, both for our members and for children and young people themselves.

Our vision to 2025 focuses on our commitment to the following groups:

- Our Camden based members, who look to us to represent them, support them, champion their services and help source funding and partnership opportunities with them
- Our Camden based businesses and partners, who look to us to offer a onestop-shop for investment in Camden's children and youth sector space but are not sure where to start
- Our key stakeholders, including Camden Council and the wider Camden voluntary sector, to ensure we are offering distinct and unique opportunities for our members
- Camden's children and young people, whose voices we need to guide our work
- The national network of Young People's Foundations, of which we are a member, which works towards achieving common goals for children and young people across the country in partnership with the public, private and voluntary sectors

We hope you will join us on this journey – and we look forward to working with you.



OUR STORY

A MEMBERSHIP ORGANISATION ROOTED IN CAMDEN

Established in 2017, Young Camden Foundation is a registered charity set up to address the growing uncertainty of long-term investment in the children and young people sector in Camden and the need to build more cross-sector partnerships and to safeguard high-quality play and youth provision



Since 2017, YCF has grown in size and in impact and has awarded nearly £1.4 million to local Camden-based organisations via 202 projects, benefitting over 10,000 children and young people in the borough

We are now comprised of over 130 full, affiliate and strategic members, including 86 Camdenbased members and have established long-running grants programmes addressing local needs

OUR STORY

A MEMBERSHIP ORGANISATION ROOTED IN CAMDEN

Our vision is for more powerful and ambitious partnerships between members and across Camden's public, private and voluntary sector to be built and nurtured, to ensure all children and young people have equal access to the incredible opportunities Camden has, so that they are safe, empowered to participate in decisions that affect them, and supported to achieve their full potential.

These partnerships across Camden-based members, corporate partners and supporters form innovative and sustainable opportunities for the benefit of young people, brokering more investment and building more capacity in the sector. We are motivated by our common values of collaboration, equality, community and sustainability in all that we do.

Young Camden Foundation aims to provide a new model of local support for its members, which includes building capacity and better equipping the community with resources and funding, connecting and working with organisations to develop new and entrepreneurial approaches to supporting young people and championing critical issues facing the local community.

OUR STORY

A MEMBERSHIP ORGANISATION ROOTED IN CAMDEN

Our members range from community centres and associations to arts organisations, sports clubs, supplementary education organisations, outdoor activity and learning clubs, and theatres. Each member is registered in the London Borough of Camden and is focusing on or working substantially with children and young people in the area. All our members engage in life-changing work for children and young people.

Our full members are based in Camden, a complex place, with a rich history and a distinct, vibrant culture. According to 2020 estimates, Camden is home to over 90,000 young people (aged 25 and under) making up 33% of the borough's population. Camden is an incredible place to grow up with some of the best children and youth sector provision in the capital and some incredible educational opportunities.

Camden is proudly one of the most diverse and culturally rich communities in the country. Our borough is also one of the fastest growing commercial areas in the UK, home to the third highest number of businesses in the country, after Westminster and Birmingham, and home to the second highest number of business start-ups in London.

At the same time, like much of London, Camden has significant wealth and relative poverty, often existing side by side, in a community where 37% of children and young people live in relative poverty, and 19% of Camden households have an annual median income of less than £20,000.

Our community is complex, with strengths and challenges, and YCF's incredible members serve Camden's children, young people and families throughout, including during the pandemic, where our community faced many hardships.



The impact of the pandemic has shown that children and young people, and therefore the sector, are in need of greater support than ever. At the same time, YCF's history shows us that a place-based organisation that understands its community and its members is an essential means of strengthening both the sector and the outlook for Camden's children and young people.

Our strategy to 2025 will work in service of our key stakeholders, all of whom are integral to the success of our work, around the following strategic objectives:

SERVING OUR MEMBERS

We are proud that **89% of our members** believe that the Young Camden Foundation supports partnerships across the CYP sector in Camden, with **77% of members** reporting that they partnered with other charities to deliver youth services in the 12 months before the data was collected. **93%** rated their overall satisfaction with YCF as either four or five stars, with satisfaction increasing by 25% over the last two years.


Our members will remain the heart of Young Camden Foundation's work to 2025, and we are here for them, whatever they need.

MAKING IT EASIER FOR BUSINESSES TO INVEST IN CAMDEN'S CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE

We know that Camden has businesses that want to invest in young people because of their desire to be positive corporate citizens and actively engaged in youth futures in Camden. What is good for the future of Camden is good for Camden's businesses.

We want YCF to become a one-stop-shop for business partners who want to invest but do not know where to start. Our corporate partners have been some of our biggest champions over the past five years, and we seek to strengthen and grow those relationships.

Over the next three years, we will:

Better understand Camden's business community: YCF will work to better understand the nature and spread of businesses in Camden, from multi-nationals and small to medium sized businesses with headquarters in our community, so we can better serve as a one-stop-shop for all those seeking to invest in our children and young people.

We will work with our existing corporate partners to ensure that our partnerships are as strong as they can be, whether businesses want to offer financial support via our grants or support in-kind, such as through work experience placements.

Make the case for investing in Camden's children and young people sector: YCF will develop strengthened means of communicating the benefits of investing in Camden's children and young people sector. Such local investment allows businesses to have a real and direct impact on the lives of young people on their 'doorstep' and in a way they can closely connect with.

MAKING IT EASIER FOR BUSINESSES TO INVEST IN CAMDEN'S CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE

Provide a range of offers for corporate partners, from grants funding to in-kind support: Whatever Camden's businesses want to offer the sector, Young Camden Foundation will be here to facilitate relationships. As the 'go to' organisation in Camden for corporate partners seeking to positively impact youth futures and invest in the youth voluntary sector in Camden, YCF will offer simple ways in which businesses can contribute space, time or money. We will create a model that matches partners with members, creating meaningful collaboration and opportunities for both.

CONNECTING ACROSS THE BOROUGH OF CAMDEN

YCF is rooted in our Camden community, and we want to continue to create and nurture connections between those who share our vision for children and young people. The London Borough of Camden has its own thriving voluntary sector and a Local Authority that understands the value of our work, which we benefit from enormously.

Over the next few years, we will:

- Add value to Camden's voluntary sector: YCF will continue to build strong relationships with sector partners, while proudly advocating for investment in the children and young people sector.
- Work towards securing training for our membership base: YCF will continue to be responsive to and in tune with sector needs, championing youth work at every opportunity. We will work with our sector friends to understand where our members in the Camden voluntary sector have need and will work to ensure those needs are met, so our members are well-equipped to meet the often complex needs Camden's young people face.
- Support the principles of good youth work: We will conduct a comprehensive youth work skills and experience audit of our members to understand where the needs are for training and development, so the principles of good youth work are shared across our members in Camden.
- Strengthen our impact stories: YCF will continue to strengthen our communication and data collection processes to ensure we are capturing detailed information and communicating effectively, to facilitate better storytelling processes.



CONNECTING ACROSS THE BOROUGH OF CAMDEN

Grow our strong partnership with Camden Council: We will continue to develop our strong relationship with Camden Council, whether through the provision of standalone grants programmes, close work with the Integrated Youth Team or the delivery of the large-scale Holiday Activities and Food Fund. We will maintain and grow our close partnership with Camden's Integrated Youth Services team to ensure as much expertise is shared between Camden's in-house services and our members as possible.

PUTTING CAMDEN'S CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE'S VOICES AT THE HEART OF OUR WORK

The pandemic has been particularly tough on young people, and we know that while Camden's children and young people are well supported through our incredible members, YCF can and must continue to advocate for them. YCF's value of equality means we are committed to supporting those who may otherwise be left behind with the opportunity to influence decision-making, and often this means young people themselves.

YCF is extremely proud of the work that we have done to date to involve young people in the work that we do and to actively listen to their views and experiences, using these to inform our programmes.

Over the next three years we will advance these aims by:

- Improving our offer to young people: We will relaunch the Young Ambassadors programme and work to strengthen youth participation in public decision-making. YCF will seek to embed a renewed Young Ambassadors programme throughout our work and continue to facilitate youth engagement in our grants decision-making panels. We will also improve the young person journey on our website and social media channels to ensure that young people encountering YCF are directed towards services and opportunities that are relevant for them.
- Better engagement with schools: We will establish improved ways to engage with Camden's infant, primary and secondary schools, so parents and young people are informed of opportunities available to them.
- Strengthening our impact case studies: YCF will collate case studies of children, families and young people benefitting from member services to better tell the story of the difference the sector makes to Camden's community.



PUTTING CAMDEN'S CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE'S VOICES AT THE HEART OF OUR WORK

- Publishing research about growing up in Camden: Over the next twelve months, we will conduct a needs analysis and produce an external-facing publication exploring the situation young people in Camden face, drawing on expertise from our members, from schools and from young people themselves. This will draw on existing literature in Camden, including the borough's own poverty analysis review, youth review and education review, as well as external sources.
- Campaigning with and for Camden's young people: Our longer-term ambition is that we will be equipped to undertake relevant research, campaigning and advocacy for the benefit of Camden's members and the wider youth work sector.
